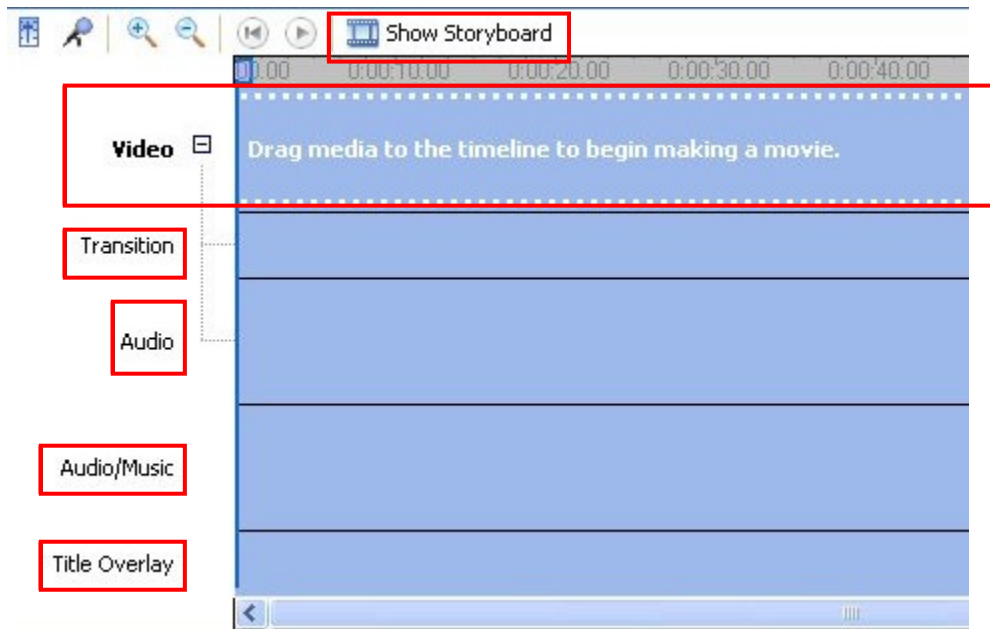


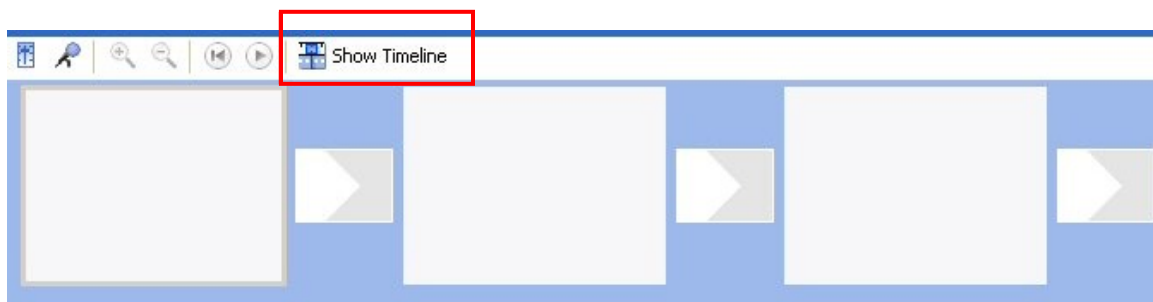
Movie Maker 2

Adding Clips to the Movie

The next step is to add the media to the storyboard. It is possible to work in either one of two views. Below is the timeline view. Notice that there is a separate track for video, transitions, audio (associated with a video clip), another audio track for either narration or music, and a title overlay track.



We want to begin with the storyboard view. If it is not showing, click on the “Show Storyboard” button above the timeline to switch to the storyboard view. Your screen should now show the storyboard. You can return to the timeline view at any time by clicking the “Show Timeline” icon.

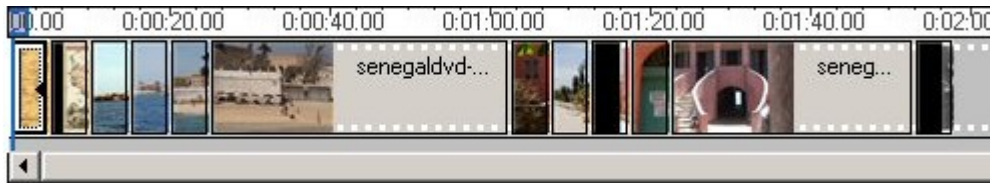


Add the clips in the following order (notice that they are in alphabetical order according to filename in the Collections pane), by dragging and dropping them into the large boxes on the storyboard.

1. map
2. westafricanslavetrade
3. goreeapproach4
4. goreeapproach7

5. goreebeach1
6. senegaldvd-1 01 8 (video clip)
7. goreestreet4
8. goreeesclavestatue
9. maisondesesclaves
10. maisondesesclavesentree
11. senegaldvd-1 01 9 (video clip)
12. slavesonship

Once you've got all the clips in the storyboard, let's switch to the timeline view to do some editing. Click the "Show Timeline" button above the storyboard to change views. Your timeline should look like this:



Let's take a look at what we've got so far. Click the play button in the monitor window to preview your project



Notice that you have a combination of still images and video clips. Notice also that the audio that accompanies the video clips is just background noise that we won't want to keep. We'll tackle this issue in a minute.
