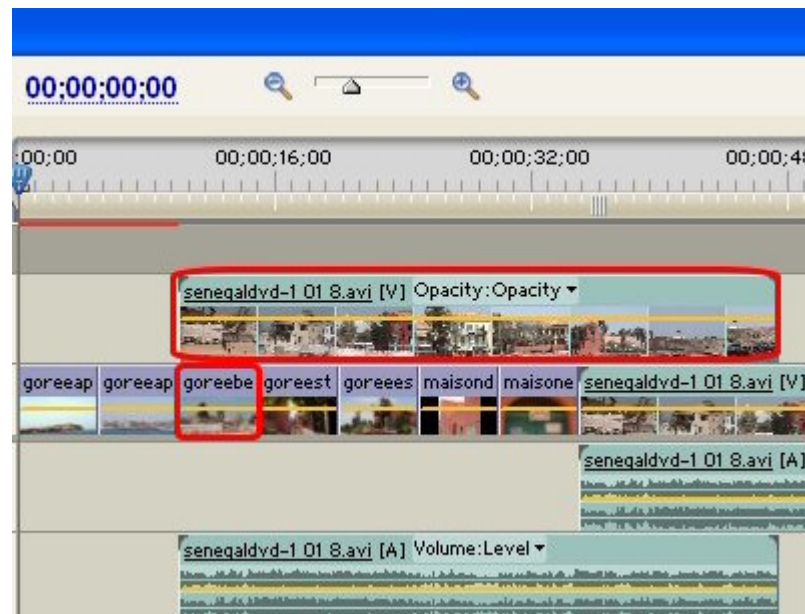


Adobe Premiere Elements

Creating a Picture-in-Picture Effect

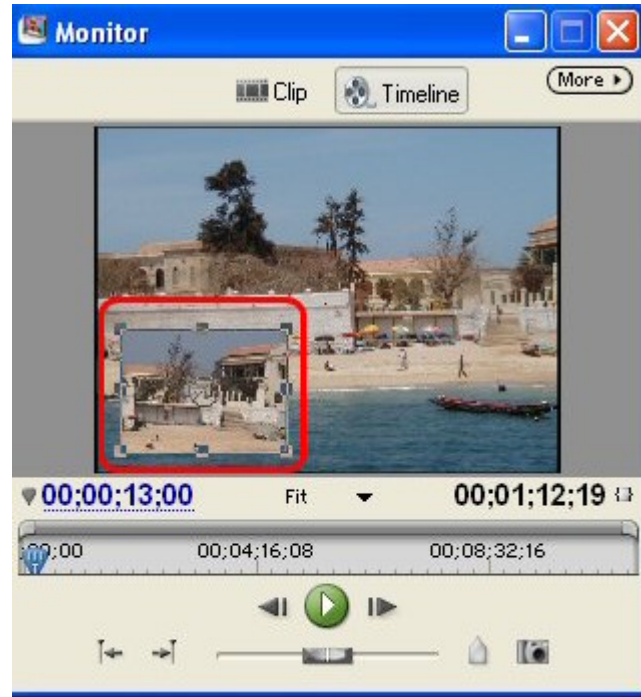
Creating a picture-in-picture effect will make you feel like Stephen Spielberg. It's really fancy, but REALLY simple to do and will dazzle your family and friends. We'll do a practice using a still image and a video clip from our Gorée video.

1. First, delete the first video clip from the timeline (we'll use it in a minute for our picture-in-picture). This is the clip named senegaldvd-1 01 8.avi. The image we will use as the outer picture is the still image of the beach (goréebeach1.jpg)—the third image in the timeline.
2. In the media window, locate the clip that you want to use as the inner picture (senegaldvd-1 01 8.avi), and drag it to video track 2 above the third image (goreebeach1.jpg). Make sure that you align the clips so that the inner-picture clip (the video clip) is directly above the outer-picture clip (the still image of the beach). It should look like this:



3. In the Timeline window, select the inner-picture clip (the video) and drag the current-time 🕒 indicator to any point within it.
4. In the Monitor window, click the clip image to select it.
5. Do one or both of the following to position the clip:
 - To adjust the size of the image, drag one of the corner points.

- To adjust the location of the image, click within it and drag it to another location. When you finish, it will look like this. Play your video to get the effect!



6. Finally, we need to adjust the length of the still image to accommodate the length of the video. Position your cursor at the end (on the right hand side) of the still image (gorebeach1) and drag it until it matches the end of the video. Voilà!! Picture-in-Picture. Isn't that easy??
